Our aim at IANL Academy is to help our pupils to learn, understand and implement the beautiful core teachings of Islam. We aim to deliver teaching of the highest quality in a professional, structured and disciplined manner, and with the underlying objective to enable the pupils to build a strong connection with Allah, and establish the best character, conduct and moral values that are embodied in the Sunnah of the Prophet (saw), and are of so much importance for a Muslim living in the West.

We appreciate the importance of creating a safe and nurturing environment that is friendly, understanding and intellectually stimulating for the pupils in order to allow them to enjoy and truly benefit on this blessed and rewarding path of seeking knowledge. In addition to learning the foundation principles of Islam, we aim to help the pupils develop many key skills that will assist them in their other studies and outside the classroom, such as building confidence, being able to work alone or thrive in a team, and developing routine and good habits.

ACADEMY INFORMATION & CODE OF CONDUCT

In this section we have outlined all key information relating to the general functioning and operations of IANL Academy, as well as the Code of Conduct guidelines, which all parents / guardians and pupils must operate within.

1. IANL Academy Location and Times

All classes are held at IANL, 683-685 High Road, London N12 0DA. Boys classes take place on the first floor, and girls classes in the basement.

IANL Academy currently offers two types of class: (1) Standard Classes covering Quran / Qaidah & Islamic Studies; and (2) Hifdh Classes covering memorization of Quran. All classes take place between 5-7pm.

Boys (Aged 6 – 17yrs):

- 3-day Standard Classes (Mon/Wed/Fri)
- 2-day Standard Classes (Tue/Thur)
- 2-day Hifdh Class (Tue/Thur)

Girls (Aged 6 -17yrs):

- 3-day Standard Classes (Mon/Wed/Fri)

Provisional term dates for the 2019/2020 academic year are as follows:

Term 1: 2nd September – 20th December

Term 2: 6th January – 10th April

Exams: Week of 27th January

Term 3: 25th May – 21st July

There may be additional optional classes in Ramadan.

To ensure that all our pupils receive maximum learning time, it is of great importance that every pupil attends on time.

Children should not arrive at IANL more than 10 minutes before the class begins, and should sign the register with the teacher immediately on arrival. Punctuality is essential, and in order to facilitate this, the door to the classes will be locked at 5:05pm and **entry will not be granted to any pupil after this time. IANL ACADEMY does not accept any responsibility for pupils who are not allowed into class due to late arrival. We strongly advise not to send your child to class if he / she is likely to arrive after 5pm.**

We aim to encourage pupils to practice what they learn, hence why we require pupils to ensure they offer salaah in Jamaah during class hours.

Therefore if there is a Jamaah at 5pm, all pupils should arrive at the latest by 4:55pm so that they can register and pray the salaah in Jamaah. Salaah in Jamaah for the pupils will be held in their classrooms, and not in the main prayer hall.

If there is a Jamaah starting prior to 7:05pm, pupils are expected to stay until the completion of the salaah before leaving.

Pupils arriving late for class will face disciplinary action in accordance with section 12 below.

No pupil will be allowed to leave the class early unless permission has been granted by the parent and communicated to the teachers in a suitable manner.

Parents should collect their children as soon as the class ends (either 7pm or after the salaah if the jamaah is prior to 7:05). IANL does not accept any responsibility for children once this time ends.

In case of an emergency where a parent is supposed to collect a pupil but is unable to do so, it is essential that the parent informs the teachers/staff at IANL Academy and spends the waiting time in their company. The pupil should not talk to strangers or wait at the Masjid without informing the IANL Academy staff.

2. Class Structure & Curriculum

Pupils are generally placed in classes that fit their age bracket. However, in some instances (particularly for Qaidah) pupils may be placed in a class that does not match their age bracket due to their level of knowledge.

Standard Classes follow the following curriculum:

- Qaidah (how to read the Quran with correct pronunciation) & Quran Recitation (with tajweed)
- Islamic Studies (covering aspects of fiqh, aqeedah, adab, and Stories of Prophets) using the An Nasihah Curriculum
- Duas
- Small surah memorisation

Hifdh Classes only cover memorization of the Quran

3. Fees

All parents must pay a Registration fee of £60 per pupil on acceptance of a place at IANL Academy. This is a non-refundable one off payment, and is in addition to the term fees.

Term fees are paid on a term-by-term basis, and all parents are responsible for ensuring that fees are paid prior to the deadline.

The fees must be paid within 2 weeks of the start of the term.

The term fee structure for 2019 / 2020 is as follows:

- All 3-day classes are £150 per pupil per term
- All 2-day classes are £100 per pupil per term

Please note that there are no early payment or sibling discounts in operation.

If the term fees are not paid by the payment deadlines, the pupil may lose their place at IANL Academy and will have to re-apply and re-register to join if they wish to attend again (and therefore will have to pay the Registration Fee of £60 again).

New pupils will receive a special Welcome Pack (Quran/Qaidah/Tajweed book, Dua book, Islamic Studies books and shoulder bag) for a discounted £10 (RRP £25).

No fees will be refunded if a child is suspended or excluded, or is absent from classes for any reason. Fees will also be reviewed annually.

If you are experiencing financial difficulties and unable to afford the fees, please speak to the IANL Academy team immediately. At our discretion we may explore the possibility of finding a sponsor for the fees. In order to facilitate sponsorship, IANL Academy will require you to fill an extra form disclosing your personal finances.

4. Uniform & Hygeine

IANL Academy has a dress code that all pupils must adhere to. The dress code for boys is a White Thobe (also called a Jubba) and White Cap (Topi), and for girls is a plain Black Abayah and plain Black Scarf (with no beading / patterns).

Underclothing (i.e. t shirts, jeans etc) must not be visible.

No jewellery is allowed to be worn, except a watch.

As a Muslim, personal hygiene is also of great importance. Therefore, pupils should ensure that their clothes are clean, and that they have made wudhu at home prior to coming to class.

Failure to abide by the uniform requirements will result in disciplinary action.

5. Stationery, Books & Prohibited Items

All pupils must bring their own stationery and notebooks to class.

All pupils are required to bring their own books (including Quran) to class each day. The books should be in accordance with the Indo-Pak script, unless the teacher gives permission otherwise. The pupils will not be allowed to use the copies of Quran at IANL.

Pupils will be given a homework diary – which the parent **must** sign off before the pupil returns back to class. Warnings and important issues (including disciplinary) may be highlighted to the parents through teacher's notes in these homework diaries.

Each class has its own coursebook & workbook as outlined in section 2 above. Pupils can purchase additional copies from IANL Academy for under £10.

Any dangerous or anti social items (including items such as lighters, cigarettes and pen knives) will be confiscated by the teacher and only returned on receipt of a letter by the parent requesting it.

Chewing gum is prohibited at IANL Academy.

Mobile phones are permitted but **MUST NOT** be “on” or taken out of the pocket. If the teacher finds that it has been taken out of the pocket, it will be confiscated. Again, parents will have to contact the teacher to reclaim the item.

6. Homework and Exams

Throughout the term it is important that all pupils are encouraged by their parents to engage in a routine of self-study / family-study outside the classroom. A simple routine of reviewing the class notes each day at home can result in major improvements for the pupil over the course of a term.

To compliment this, a pupil will be given some homework to do. This will enable the teacher to monitor his progress and to offer him the required help if needed. It also allows parents to know the content being taught to the pupil, whilst allowing the pupil to develop skills and learn time management. Homework will always be a revision of an existing topic covered in class, and should usually not take more than 30 minutes to complete. It is essential that parents sign the homework diary to show that they are aware that the homework was provided and completed.

If for any reason a pupil is unable to complete the homework, then the parent should provide a letter explaining the reasons why. Failure to complete homework assignments without a valid reason will result in disciplinary action.

Exams will be held twice a year. In order to ensure that the standard of teaching remains high and pupils can progress within their age group, pupils who fail the exams may be asked to perform a re-sit, may be placed in a younger class (if deemed appropriate by the teachers), or may be permanently excluded from IANL Academy if the examination performance falls below the required standard.

7. Absence from IANL Academy

In order for pupils to maximise their potential and make significant progress, it is essential that they are consistent in attending classes throughout the term. Absences can significantly affect a pupil's progress, and for this reason we require all pupils to have an attendance rate of 85%.

All absences must be authorised by the parents. Therefore if a child is unable to attend IANL Academy for any reason, the parent must inform the teacher by calling or sending a message before the class begins at 5pm. If for any reason a prior notification is not possible, then a signed note by the parents must be delivered to the teacher the next day. Any absence without authorisation by the parents may result in disciplinary action.

Any pupil who is absent from IANL Academy for more than 10 days in a term without providing a reason that is acceptable to the teachers (i.e. sickness) will lose their place for the rest of the term and will have to re-apply for admittance. The re-admittance is not guaranteed. Parents are advised for this reason to avoid taking their children on holiday during term times.

8. General Behavior

Good behavior is of paramount importance in Islam, and especially for students of the religion and those attending classes in the Masjid.

All pupils must show respect to the teachers and their fellow classmates at all times.

This includes abstaining from all foul language, and committing any action that may be deemed abusive, anti-social or unbefitting of a Masjid environment.

Pupils are also expected to avoid shouting and making noise in the Masjid, and avoid damaging any property.

Pupils should not eat / drink during class unless a medical condition necessitates it. If a pupil has a genuine need to attend to the toilet, this will be granted. However, due to the limited facilities and short time available for teaching, it is advisable that pupils avoid using the toilet during the class unless it is an emergency. If a teacher adjudges that a pupil is unnecessarily wasting time by taking too long / too many toilet breaks, the parents will be informed.

Misbehavior will not be tolerated and result in disciplinary action.

9. Child Safety

Parents must ensure that the pupil arrives at IANL safely on time, and is picked up on time.

On arrival at IANL all pupils must go straight to their classroom and report to the teacher present. All pupils must sign the register.

Classrooms have been exclusively designated for pupils and staff of IANL Academy and no other persons (including parents) are allowed entry during the operating hours of IANL Academy, except if granted permission by the teachers.

All boys should use the toilet facility provided on the 1st floor whilst attending class, and should not go to the Main Prayer Hall or Basement Wudhu area without the permission of the teachers. All girls should use the toilet facility provided in the basement – and should be accompanied by the teaching assistant.

IANL Academy is not responsible in any way for any accident or injury incurred by a pupil whilst travelling either to or from IANL.

Parents must inform the teaching staff (on the Application Form) of any medical conditions relating to the pupil and any medications that may need administering during the operating hours of IANL Academy.

In case of a minor accident or injury being incurred on site during the operating hours of IANL Academy, staff who are qualified first aiders will be made aware of the situation in order to administer basic first aid treatment (plasters / bandages etc) to the pupil.

We will ensure that all adults working with pupils are DBS cleared.

10. Anti Bullying

It is essential that every child at IANL Academy feels safe and secure, and is able to participate comfortably in classes without the fear of intimidation and bullying. Hence any form of bullying will not be tolerated and will be dealt with seriously.

As there is no legal definition of bullying, we have chosen to define it as behavior that is systematic and on-going, and is deliberately hurtful and distressing to the victim. It can be in many forms including physical, verbal, psychological, and social (through means such as exclusion), and is often targeted at those who cannot defend themselves.

We believe that it is the combined responsibility of the teachers, pupils and parents to ensure that bullying does not occur at IANL Academy. Therefore any parents or pupils, who suspect that bullying may be occurring, must report the matter to a teacher or member of staff.

11. Discipline

Where a pupil is in breach of this Code of Conduct, then they may face disciplinary action. Such action will *normally* take the following form:

- 1st breach – Verbal warning to pupil
- 2nd breach – Contact with parents (either through homework diary / WhatsApp message or phone call)
- 3rd breach – Further contact with parents (again through the same methods). Alternatively a meeting with parents or a suspension may occur.
- 4th breach – Permanent exclusion from IANL Academy and forfeiting of all fees paid

Although it is expected that most breaches of this Code of Conduct will follow the course of action above, where the teachers deem the breach extremely serious or wholly unacceptable (or where parents regularly fail to respond to communication from the Head Teacher), then IANL Academy reserves the right to permanently exclude the pupil without giving prior warnings. Such an action by IANL Academy will only be taken if no other solution is deemed applicable or effective under the particular circumstances.

12. Parents Evening & Awards

Typically once each term, IANL Academy will host a Parents Evening. This is an integral means of communication between the teachers and parents, and is a chance to discuss the pupil's progress and give advice / suggestions on how to improve in the future.

In addition we believe that it is important for pupil's efforts and hard work to be rewarded appropriately, especially as it can be an added motivation for future improvement. We will therefore issue reports after each exam period detailing their marks and the progress they've made with their Islamic studies, in addition to highlighting their general akhlaaq and attendance.

There will also be a Presentation Day after the summer exams in which upto three prizes will be given in each class. These prizes will be given to the two highest performing pupils, and the pupil who demonstrates the best akhlaaq, attendance & effort.

13. Entrance & Selection Criteria

We are very proud to host pupils from many diverse ethnic, social and education backgrounds.

Prior to entrance at IANL Academy, we may ask to meet with the parent(s) and prospective pupil in order to discuss the policies of IANL Academy, and may ask the prospective pupil to sit a short test to determine whether they are a suitable fit.

Although the classes tend to be grouped according to age group, this is sometimes adjusted if a prospective pupil has an advanced background in Islamic studies prior to joining IANL Academy.

Due to our limited capacity, prospective pupils may be added to the waiting list if no spaces are available in the relevant age category.

Children who already have siblings in IANL Academy, and those who live in closer proximity to IANL Academy will be given priority if the demand exceeds supply of places available.

All new pupils who are accepted into IANL Academy must pay a non-refundable £60 registration fee, in addition to the thrice-yearly term fees. Please see section 3 for more information.

Applications for admission into IANL Academy must be made prior to the start of the Autumn Term.

14. Our Head Teacher

We are very proud and honored to have Imam Shokat Patel as our Head Teacher.

Imam Shokat completed his Hifdh in London before spending 7 years in India graduating as an Alim at the prestigious Darul Uloom Arabiyya Islamiyya Kantharia. He then returned to the UK and spent the last 18 years teaching at the Darul Uloom in Kent and Quwwat ul Islam (Forest Gate), in addition to spending 5 years with Safar Academy. He specializes in teaching tajweed, tafseer and hadeeth.

Imam Shokat was appointed in 2016 as a full time Imam at IANL (having worked as a part time Imam over the last 10 years).

He is renowned amongst the IANL community for his excellent tajweed, for delivering articulate & beneficial khutbahs, and for his hadeeth and reminder series after salaah.

Outside of his work, Imam Shokat enjoys reading, writing, football and badminton. He has also participated in numerous charitable events, including climbing a mountain for Ummah Welfare Trust, and presenting the Salam Cup.

15. Complaints

IANL Academy operates with a policy of transparency and openness, and we are always happy to answer questions, explain our practices, and alleviate any concerns that parents may have. In addition, IANL Academy fully understands that a respectful and supportive partnership between teachers and parents can be very effective in enabling pupils to feel motivated and excel in their studies. For this reason we are always open to feedback, suggestions and complaints from parents, although we ask that this is done in the prescribed manner below to ensure that Islamic morals and virtues are maintained throughout. We would also like to mention that in most cases we are confident that these are related simply to misunderstandings that are easily solvable in an amicable way during a short meeting or discussion.

Protocol for complaints:

If the matter is related to general feedback or suggestions – this can be given on the phone, or by means of a note.

If the matter is related to a complaint – this should be given in writing (by email to madrasah@ianl.org.uk) or in a pre arranged face-to-face meeting with the teacher or member of staff (with the pupil absent from discussions).

If the parent chooses to write an email, please allow up to 7 working days for a reply so that the staff can arrange a time to discuss the complaint sincerely and as a group.

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16. Contact with Parents

IANL Academy will keep in touch with parents through a wide range of communications including notes in the homework diary, phone calls, WhatsApp messages, emails & letters given to the pupils or sent in the post. For this reason, it is essential that IANL Academy always have up to date contact details for the pupil's parents.
